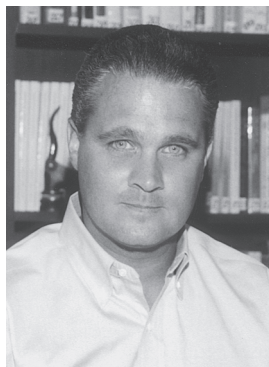

Wendell W. Young, IV, Is President of United Food and Commercial Workers Local 1776, and an International Vice President of the UFCW International Union. He was born in 1961 in Philadelphia. He attended Archbishop Ryan High School as well as Penn State and LaSalle Universities. He is a graduate of Saint Joseph's University's Comey Institute of Industrial Relations where he was an Advisory Board member and also taught courses in labor economics and collective bargaining.

From 1977 to 1983, Wendell W. Young, IV was employed at Penn Fruit and Acme Markets. In 1983, he began his career as a union representative, in which capacity he worked as a field representative and an organizer. Subsequently as the union's lead negotiator, he assumed responsibility for all collective bargaining activities. He has spearheaded a number of initiatives as a union negotiator to establish affordable child care and education benefits for working families in the changing economy. Another crucial aspect of his professional life has been his leadership as a trustee overseeing health and pension benefit trust funds.
